

Tips on Using Publications

Use the Catalog

The [Catalog](#) is designed to help you find exactly what you need in each of the 10 publications listed on this site. The *Catalog* lists the content, availability, and time frame addressed in each of the reports. The *Catalog* further provides hyperlinks to move you directly to a publication.

Important Publications Information

The final editions of [Statistical Highlights](#) and [Mineral Revenue Distributions](#) were published in 1999. Information formerly provided in the two reports is now available in a more complete and convenient format in *Instant Information*.

The [Mineral Revenue Collections](#) report is published each quarter throughout a calendar year to provide immediate revenue information. The [Mineral Revenues](#) report, our flagship publication, is uploaded as each section is completed, beginning in January after the close of a calendar year. The complete *Mineral Revenues* report is normally available in the Fall.

Glossary Information

Each publication, other than *Statistical Highlights*, contains an internal glossary unique to that report. The [Glossary](#), a comprehensive set of mineral terms used within government and industry, includes terms from all publications.

Thumbnails and Bookmarks

These tools, designed by Adobe®, enable you to quickly locate individual sections of a large publication. Thumbnails provide small photos of the pages, in sequential order. If you're looking for tables or graphs, you can spot them in these small views, and go to them by clicking on the thumbnail. Bookmarks is an outline of the report using chapter titles and section headings. By clicking on the title or heading, you can again move directly to that section of the publication.

Find

You may open the "Find" text box by clicking on the icon represented by the small pair of binoculars on the toolbar. Enter the word or term you are seeking. The tool will search the publication until it locates the first reference to the term or word in the report.
